DEGREE

Food & Beverage Management

To earn an Associate's Degree, students must complete:

- All major course requirements with a "C" or better;
- (2) 25 units of (Native) General Education requirements;
- (3) the cultural diversity & reading requirements;
- (4) any elective courses to complete a minimum of 60 units; and
- (5) have a minimum GPA of 2.0. At least 50% of all major course work must be completed at Cypress College.
